1. The title of the paper is correct.
2. Check if the abstract describes the paper well, or very well.
3. Check if the paper is well written.
4. Consider whether and why the paper is original.
5. Comment on whether what the paper covers has not been done before by another author. What is new. How relevant it is to the journal's policy theme.
6. Does it comply with the review of the bibliography of the specialised subject. How does it contribute to this.
7. What scientific method it uses. Do you consider it to be the most appropriate. What comments would you make. It has no errors. How it interprets the results. How to improve it.
8. What conclusions are obtained and if they are the most suitable.
9. The references are well written.
